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Exhibitions

Ringve Museum, Trondheim

On 20 November 1997 a new exhibition 'Ringve 1000' was opened. Earlier in the year, problems with fund-raising dictated that work on the permanent exhibition at the museum should be suspended, and a low-budget, storage exhibition was proposed as an alternative. In 'Ringve 1000' one thousand instruments are shown together in one hall, an overwhelming sight. The exhibition's themes include 'Music while you walk', 'Outdoor life, hunting and fishing music', but as in all our museums, the rationale of the exhibition was also determined by the available space.

The whole exhibition is reminiscent of a supermarket,

and indeed shelves were borrowed from one for it. To avoid the high cost of special mounting devices for the instruments they have been placed on bags of cloth half filled with sand. It was possible to support the instruments almost all the way round by pushing them carefully into the sand. Around 3,000 kg of very fine sand was used. The security problem was solved by mounting fine-mesh fishing net from the top to the bottom of the shelves. The major expense of the exhibition was the professional lighting system, which can be re-used.

Ringve 1000 is intended as a contribution to the 1000 year Jubilee of the town. It should stimulate interest in the new exhibition which is to be opened in 1999, and it is hoped that it will also generate funds for it. So far, the exhibition has turned out to be very successful.
